# 1. Call to Order Board of Directors for 2019 – 2020

The Organizational meeting was called to order at 7:06PM in the Education Services Building by Superintendent Tuetken. Present were Directors Hoover, Helms, Haughenbury, R Benesch, Boss and Ries; Superintendent Tuetken, Elementary Principal/Director of School Improvement Graven, Principal Beaty, and Secretary Peyton. Director JBenesch was absent.

# 2. Report Election Results

Election results were shared with the board by Superintendent Tuetken:

Director District #1 Ryan Benesch received 269 votes and there were 7 write-ins.

Director District #2 Connie Helms received 232 votes and there were 25 write-ins.

Director District at Large Bret Haughenbury received 274 votes and there were 5 write-ins.

Ryan Benesch was elected for the office of Director District #1 for a term of 4 years, Connie Helms was elected for the office of Director District #2 for a term of 4 years and Bret Haughenbury was elected for the office of Director District At Large for a term of 4 years. It was moved by RBenesch, seconded by Haughenbury to accept the election results. Motion carried 6-0.
